

Internship Strategies

Gaining industry experience through internships is one of the best ways to prepare for life after graduation. These short-term, hands-on roles help students explore careers, work on meaningful projects, and build valuable skills and confidence.

Top tips to secure an internship:

Start early: Begin your search at least one semester in advance, some industries recruit even earlier. You could start as early as Freshman year.

Narrow your focus: Define what industries interest you, where you'd like to work, which skills you want to develop, and the ideal timing.

Tailor your applications: Use the <u>Career Studio</u> or connect with a <u>Career Coach</u> for help with resume, cover letter, and interview prep, and make sure each application is customized.


Use a mix of strategies: Don't rely solely on job boards, combine Handshake and other platforms with networking and industry-specific searches.

Stay proactive: Keep applying until you lock in an offer, then update your resume with your new experience and stay connected with your internship contacts.

Job Searching Strategies

Searching for your first professional role can feel overwhelming, but with the right strategies, you can take control of the process. The WKU Career Development Center outlines key steps to help you stay focused and land a position that fits your skills and goals.

Top tips to strengthen your job search:

Start early: A successful job search can take six months or more, so begin planning before graduation. Early preparation gives you more time to explore and apply.

Use your network: Employers often prioritize referrals. Reach out to professors, advisors, family, and friends to uncover opportunities you may not find online.

Stay flexible: Entry-level and support roles can be excellent stepping stones. They give you the chance to prove yourself, build experience, and move into higher-level positions.

Tailor your documents: Customized résumés and cover letters stand out far more than generic ones. Show employers exactly how your skills match their needs. Remember you can always send your cover letter/resume to careehelp@wku.edu to be reviewed.


Stay consistent: The job search can be discouraging at times, but persistence pays off. Keep applying, keep having career conversations, and keep refining your approach.
